## Rugby Club

## Swim Squad/ Lane Swimming - Junior

Years 3-4, 5-6

### Trampolining Years 4-6 and 7-13



Get bouncing at lunchtime and practice your jumps, twists and somersaults under the watchful eye of our trained teacher.

### Diversity and Inclusion Years 3-4 and 7-13



Working together to explore how differences can be valued, recognised and incorporated both within and outside school, using games, research, group discussion and practical activities.

### EPQ (Extended Project Qualification) Years 12-13



The EPQ provides the opportunity for individual study in an area of each pupil's choosing. Comprising of 30 hours of teaching plus independent study, completed projects see pupils being awarded a qualification equivalent to half an A Level.

### HPQ (Higher Project Qualification) Years 10-11



The HPQ provides the opportunity for individual study in an area of each pupil's choosing. Overseen by staff mentors and culminating in a presentation, completed projects see pupils being awarded a qualification equivalent to half a GCSE.

### Leadership Passport Year 8



Led by Cranford House staff, this personal development programme encourages pupils to build their own leadership skills through activities that include embodying school values, adopting volunteering roles and embracing study-related challenges.

## Leadership, Community & Public Speaking

At Cranford we encourage our pupils as global citizens to have an understanding of our surroundings and give back to the local community. Seniors and Sixth Form students taking on extra-curricular leadership roles often enjoy the benefits of developing their presentation and public speaking skills as well as the opportunity to represent the school and our shared ethos and values.



## Model United Nations Years 10-13

Model UN (United Nations) pupils learn about diplomacy, international relations, and the UN, researching countries and practising UN formalities in preparation for a conference at Oxford University at the end of November.

## Neighbourhood Volunteering Year 9, 12-13

Senior pupils have the opportunity to make regular visits e.g. to our neighbouring old people's home, The Old Vicarage, with the aim of bringing together the generations in sharing experiences, stories, activities and friendship.

## School Enterprise Project Years 9-10

Release the entrepreneur in your child through the School Enterprise Business Challenge! This exciting activity provides pupils with the opportunity to test their own ideas and business skills as they set up and run a real business within the school. ### **Jewellery Club** Years 3-6 and 7-13




Jewellery Design Club will start with simple stringing projects and advance to first steps in metalwork and beyond. There will be lovely jewellery creations to take home too!
